8. Update on Special	Goldstein	Academic Senate President Goldstein	Information
Trustee		provided an update on the status of Special	
		Trustee assigned to Peralta Community	
		College District. Although the item will be	
		discussed at the September Board of	
		Governors meeting, the State Chancellor	
		will not make a decision during that time.	
		The faculty, by large, do not support the	
		appointment of a Special Trustee on the	
		following 3 bases:	
		1. Legal	
		Although Title V allows for State	
		oversight, the focus is on finances. Peralta	
		has made immense fiscal improvements	
		and as such, there is no legal basis for	
		imposing a Special Trustee.	
		2. Philosophical	
		Faculty support democracy and local	
		control. Our Board of Trustees are elected	
		by the communities we serve.	
		3. Historical	
		Looking at other institutions that has been	
		assigned a Special Trustee, such as	
		Compton College and City College of San	
		Francisco, the process has been very	
		disruptive and the communities were	
		adversely affected. During 1980s, the	
		PCCD has experienced the Special Trustee	
		oversight; this too has been a very	
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			disruptive process for the community with massive lay offs and dwindling enrollment.
