5. APU/Program Review – Due November 15. Justify your needs in APU/Program Review. Priority for needs will be done through APU/Program review. No word on IELM funds for equipment; waiting for VC Brown. There are data coaches to help chairs analyze the data. Faculty prioritization occurs with requests put in the APU/Program Review. The



chairs will vote on prioritization December 2021 or February 2022. If there are plans to visit and partner with high schools, put that into APU/Program Review. Only 4 programs needed to do program review. Give updates on progress from your last program review. Dom is happy to meet with you all and before the 15th.

6. SLOs – share which courses have been assessed, which courses need to be assessed and when they will be assessed.
7. Instructional Supply Funds Spending Reminder – We are a dean and staff assistant short; please be patient with requests. There is a good formula for distributing supply funds. Lilia will send out an email to see who needs supplies right away.
8. Dual Enrollment – deans are responsible for finalizing scheduling. We're not planning very well in terms of scheduling. These count as load for PT faculty. Think about contract education; all are covered by PFT contract. Letters of assignments have to go out by Nov 17. Look at the schedule, deans have to make changes in the system by Nov 12. Strategy for winter intersession: follow course enrollment closely, use marketing, possibly open new sections of courses that filled up early. A similar process is used with Spring schedule.
 - a. Sometimes working with high schools is difficult. CoA timeline for dual enrollment needs to be very close to Spring schedule timeline.
