

CoA FabLab Grand Opening

Thursday, September 27, 2018 3:30 - 5 p.m. FabLab Room D102

To implement the \$250,000 California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Makerspace Grant that the College received last year, a company called Idea Builder Labs was contracted to develop a FabLab (short for fabrication laboratory) at College of Alameda. The FabLab will officially open its doors on Thursday, September 27, 2018, from 3:30 p.m. to 5 p.m., in FabLab Room D102. Refreshments will be served and be prepared to be amazed by cutting edge

technologies. College of Alameda students using the new FabLab will learn how to use digital fabrication tools, including state-of-the-art 3D printers and a computer numerical control (CNC) router.

According to the Founder and Principal of Idea Builder Labs **Danny Beesley** the College of Alameda FabLab "will provide students open access to state-of-the-art digital fabrication equipment standard in many industries today."

"This lab will be utilized to enhance existing curriculum and programs, as well as serve as the home-base for the creation of new courses" said Beesley "In addition, students will get direct hands-on experience in the lab and utilize the equipment to fulfill classroom assignments, create products and solutions for local industry and entrepreneurship and learn by doing through the ideation and fabrication of products and projects that inspire them the most," Beesley added.

Some projects that can be made in the lab are; tangibles for assisting in teaching complex math, engineering and physics principals, custom signage, promotional goods, consumer electronics, furniture, displays, biotech equipment, custom clothing and fashion products, household goods, automotive accessories and aftermarket parts, 3d printers and CNC machines.

By having access to hands-on experiences, College of Alameda students will learn STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) skills that can lead to engineering and advanced manufacturing career pathways, which in turn contribute to a thriving, sustainable local economy. Moreover, community members who have an idea for an entrepreneurial project also will be able to enroll in maker classes to bring their ideas to life and even possibly bring a product or idea to market.

Several local organizations provided letters of support for College of Alameda's makerspace grant, including the Alameda Chamber of Commerce, City of Alameda, AAUW, Boys and Girls Club, Bay Ship & Yacht Company, West Alameda Business Association, McGuire Hester, Golden Gate Audubon Society, and Sila Nanotechnologies among others.



College of Alameda Welcomes New Head Coach

Marshall Collins has joined College of Alameda as our new head coach for men's basketball. Collins has extensive experience coaching teams with winning records in the Bay Valley Conference. He is also the head coach for the Oakland Soldiers, leading the team to win the 2017 Nike Peach Jam championship and earning himself the title of Nike Elite Youth Basketball League (EYBL) Coach of the Year.

Collins has a winning track record. He coached three seasons at Chabot College where the team made the JUCO Final Four. Before Chabot College, Collins coached six seasons at

Los Medanos where he helped his team achieve a "Top 5" ranking in the North and 8th in the State, back-to-back League MVPs, and All-State players, and four 20-plus win seasons. In 2008-2009, Collins helped put together a team that led to the most wins in Los Medanos College's history (25-8 record). His coaching accolades also include four "Top 10" offensive teams and over 20 four-year scholarships for his players throughout the years.

Coach Collins joins **Linda Thompson**, our long-standing head coach of Women's Volleyball, and **Taylor Elliott**, assistant Women's Volleyball coach, in developing our student-athletes. Cougar Athletics will continue to be led by Athletic Director **Bruce Furuya**. Go COUGARS!

CoA Reaches Out at Annual Oakland Pride

Once again, College of Alameda was proud and present at the 9th Annual Oakland Pride Parade and Festival on Sunday, September 9, 2018. According to the San Francisco Chronicle, this year's event was the biggest ever. From 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., CoA's Outreach Team engaged hundreds of Pride participants, including current students, alumna, administrators, and Peralta Board of Trustee members. As a result of the Outreach Team's high degree of community engagement, multiple partnership opportunities arose. Among them, CoA representatives spoke with a representative from My New Red Shoes, a nonprofit organization serving the Bay Area and Portland Oregon, based in Redwood City. Each year, My New Red Shoes collects thousands of new shoe donations from shoe drives led by individual donors, community groups, and corporate teams, to help students attend school with greater confidence bolstered by new shoes. Outreach staff members spoke with a local judge at the event who was interested in learning more about the College's Pathways to Law School Program and expressed interest in speaking on campus, mentoring students, or assisting them with internship placements.
