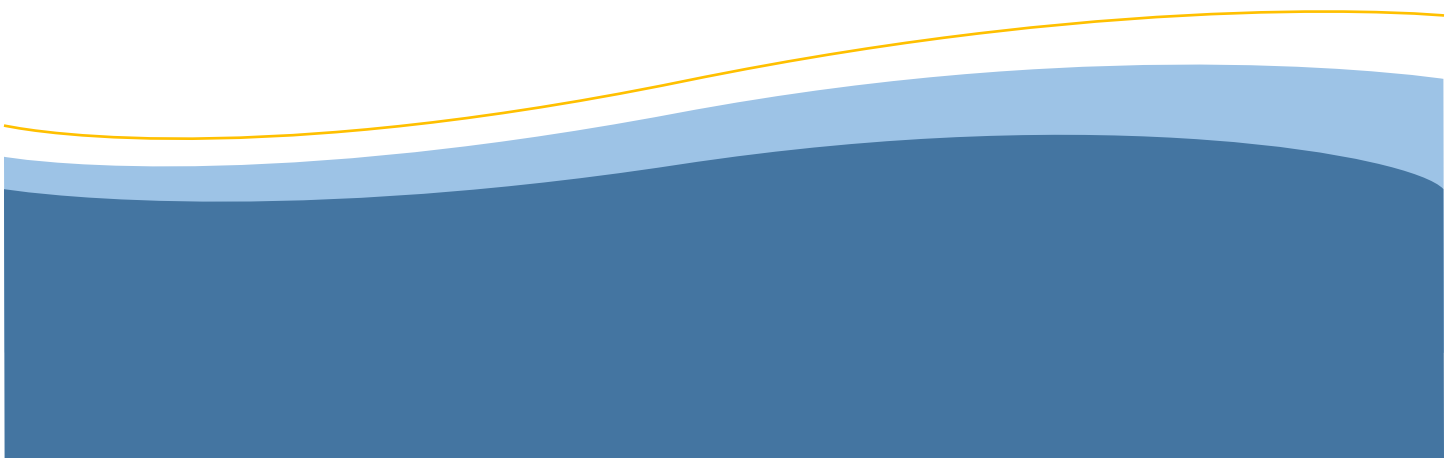


How LIS85 and LIS74 Benefit

Our Students:

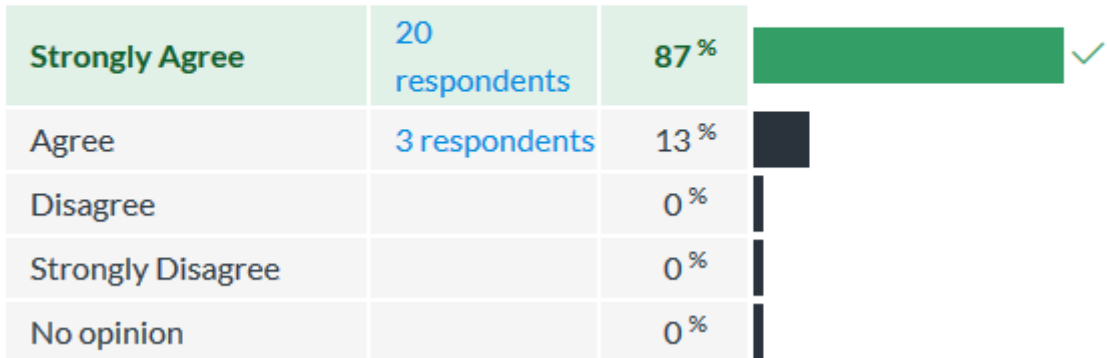

- **LIS 74—Information Seeking Behavior** - 3 units, **Meets Area E (as of May 2019) AND meets AA/AS area 4C. Acceptable for Credit: CSU, UC.** Will be offered starting in Fall 2020. Introduction to Information-seeking theories, methods and user behaviors: Psychological, emotional, and physiological aspects of information seeking; Social issues such as information overload, information access, censorship, intellectual property, privacy, and social networks. 1699.00AA/AS area 4C
- **LIS 85—Introduction to Information Resources** - 2 units, **Meets AA/AS area 4C. Acceptable** for credit: CSU, UC.
Introduction to the basic concepts and tools used in information research: Emphasis on how to develop a research topic and find, locate, evaluate, and use information; search strategies for print and online resources including reference books, catalogs, indexes, specialized databases, and the Internet. 1699.00AA/AS area 4C

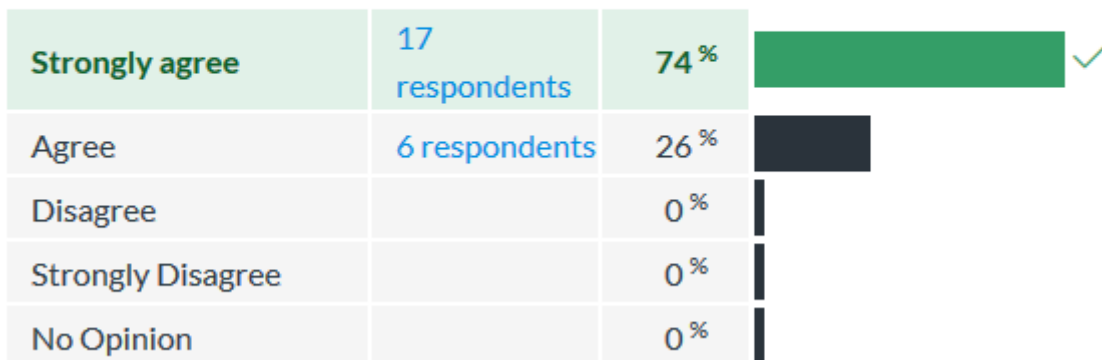
