End of Semester Canvas Reminders

Please review the Canvas End of Semester Information document. The two most important items appear below:

- Students will not have access to participate or submit work in Fall 2019 Canvas courses after December 13 unless you extend the course end date. You must go into your settings and do this before December 13; after December 13, you will not be able to edit the course end date or extend access for students without submitting a Peralta Help Desk ticket.
- After a course end date Canvas moves concluded course off the Dashboard to the "Course" tab under "Past Enrollments." If students email you stating they can't see their course anymore, direct them to the Past Enrollments area using the link above.

Online CTE Grant Update

As referenced in the October 2019 newsletter, College of Alameda was awarded an Improving Online CTE Pathways Grant by the California Virtual Campus-Online Education Initiative(CVC-OEI).

Five faculty members started working with a team of instructional designers in November to create new interactive content for online courses. Seven more CTE courses are scheduled to start work in mid-January, with the remaining seven courses starting in March. All work will be completed prior to the end of the grant implementation period on June 30, 2020. COA faculty and staff working on the grant look forward to sharing ideas and knowledge gained from the experience in the future.
