A significant portion of the program is designed to offer a wide-ranging interpretation of American History from the great civilizations of Meso-America (Aztecs, Mayas, and Incas) to the present. In addition, the department has a long and storied history of offering courses that reflect the diversity of our student population. The history department has offered courses in Latin American History, Mexican

American History, the History of Mexico, Asian History and the History of the Vietnam War. The History Department is also leading the college effort to offer courses online. The History Department has offered more sections online than any other discipline on campus. At the moment, all CSU, UC, and IGETC transferable

courses are offered online. We offer sections of 7A, 7B, 19, and 8A and 8B online. The History department at the College of Alameda will continue to be innovative and visionary in the courses that are offered and the methods delivered.


#### Describe your current utilization of facilities, including labs and other space

Whereas the overall decrease of enrollment district wide, the department's heavy commitment to offering multiple sections during the two intersession periods, will continue to help our department enrollment numbers in comparison to others.
