What is the CVC Consortium?

The CVC Consoritum is a group of 65 California Community Colleges that work together to address online achievement gaps and increase student access to fully-resourced online courses.

The Consortium provides structure and guidance for colleges to achieve the following:

- Increase growth for online course development, approval, and delivery.
- Facilitate robust faculty/staff orientation, professional development, and support.
- Assist in the development and delivery of comprehensive online learner readiness resources and other student support services.
- Increase the use of technologies to support online teaching and learning.
- Streamline student service delivery and the enrollment process.

What is POCR?

As a CVC Consortium College, we are eligible to apply to become a "Certified POCR Campus."

Peer Online Course Review (POCR) is a process through which faculty can voluntarily request to have online courses reviewed by trained faculty peers. The goal is to provide recommendations to improve course content, design, accessibility, and to align to the CVC
Rubric. If College of Alameda is approved, we would be permitted to award CVC "Quality Reviewed" badges locally on behalf of CVC.





Courses that are badged:

- Rise to the top of student search results in the <u>CVC</u> <u>Exchange</u>.
- Exemplify the highest level of online course design quality and accessibility standards.
- Perform +4.9 percentage points above the statewide average for online success.
